This Policy runs alongside the Aspire MAT School Uniform Policy. The information within this Appendix outlines the uniform children are required to wear at Sir John Sherbrooke Junior School.

School Uniform Policy

Children must wear the correct uniform to school. This does not have to have the SJS logo on as we appreciate there will be additional cost involved. If you do wish to purchase items with the school logo, these are available from: <https://just-schoolwear.co.uk/>



Clean, second-hand uniform is always available for anyone to reuse, please ask at reception and make donations when your child outgrows their uniform.

Hats, Headscarves or Headwear

Pupils are not allowed to wear hats, headscarves, or any other head covering inside the school building unless for religious or cultural reasons. Any head covering for religious or cultural values or hair accessories that are worn such as slides, ribbons, bobbles etc. should be simple and in school colours. No oversized bows or fancy-dress headbands should be worn in school.

Hairstyles

Pupils' hair should be neatly groomed and professional at all times. Pupils may not wear designs or words cut into their hair or permanent or temporary coloured hair at school. All long hair, if touching the shoulders or beyond, for both boys and girls must be tied up.

Nail Polish, False Nails or Make-Up

Please do not send your child to school wearing nail polish, false nails or make-up. Parents will be called into school to remove these or the child asked to wash their face.

Jewellery/Accessories

Pupils may wear a watch, without internet, messaging or camera access, and one pair of stud earrings worn in the lower ear lobe. For safety reasons all studs must be removed for PE. For safety, no other jewellery is permitted, including bracelets and necklaces, unless for religious reasons agreed with school. *Please note that the school cannot take any responsibility for any personal items that are lost or damaged.*

Footwear

Pupils must wear closed-toed, hard-soled, **all black** plain shoes with a flat sole. Footwear with flashing lights is not appropriate for school. Boots are not allowed unless for medical purposes. For health and safety reasons, open-toed sandals should not be worn, even in the summer. Trainers must only be worn for PE, not as general school shoes.

Naming Clothing and Property

Please ensure all clothing and property is clearly named so that lost articles may be easily returned. The school cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage of pupils' property and valuables.

All mislaid items are placed in the lost property box. We endeavor to return all named property. Unnamed lost property will be washed and put out for parents to re-use.

Please note, no items of clothing should have logos other than the SJS logo.

School Uniform

- Black or navy skirt or trousers
- Navy sweatshirt or cardigan
- Pale blue polo shirt
- Black school shoes
- Black or navy socks or tights

PE Kit

- Plain black or navy shorts – no branded logos. Length must be at least half-way down the thigh.
- Pale blue crew neck t-shirt or polo shirt.
- Sports trainers, not fashion trainers.
- For cold weather - plain black or navy jogging bottoms or leggings with a navy sweatshirt or hoodie.
- School logoed hoodies can only be worn for PE.
- No branded sportswear or football strips.

Parents and carers must ensure clothing is appropriate for the weather.

Children who arrive at school wearing the wrong clothing will be asked to change into spare, clean uniform or PE kit for the day, which will be swapped back before home time.

For safety, children will stay in at breaktime and lunchtime and sit out of their PE lesson if they are wearing acrylic nails or they refuse to remove their jewellery.
